

Seeking Participants for the INFORM Research Study

- Can we detect more cancers at earlier stages using a simple blood test? We are seeking research volunteers to help see if this is possible.
- The purpose of the **INFORM** study is to evaluate the potential benefits of a cancer screening test in individuals who have a higher-than-average risk of developing cancer. This new test is called Galleri® and is designed to detect over 20 types of cancer using a single blood draw.

We are seeking 1,000 volunteers to participate in the INFORM study who are in at least one of the following groups:

Group 1: Cancer Predisposition Syndrome

- Age \geq 35 with pathogenic variant in cancer predisposing gene or clinically based diagnosis (e.g., NF1) OR
- Age \geq 22 with Li Fraumeni Syndrome

Group 2: Family History of Cancer

- Age \geq 45
- Adults with family history suggestive of elevated cancer risk

Participants in INFORM will be asked to:

- Read and sign an informed consent
- Provide their medical history and complete an initial questionnaire
- Provide blood samples drawn by trained practitioner
- Complete additional questionnaires during the follow-up period
